A Concert Experience of Harmony and Reconciliation Coming to Kamloops

Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc Arbour Hosts 'Music for the People'

Kamloops, B.C. – Building on the resounding success of last year's concert event, Margit and Rod Bandura, of the Margit Sky Project, announced the date for this year's concert during a delegation to Kamloops City Council on July 25. 'Music for the People—A Cultural Experience' will take place at the Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc Powwow Arbour on September 17, in conjunction with the Kwséltkten Farmers' & Artisan Market to create an unforgettable evening.

"Last year's concert was so successful that we just knew we had to bring it back and provide a place for the bridging of communities of neighbours, friends, and families to come together to enjoy the harmony of the music and to experience our unique, collective cultures," said Margit, who sings and plays rhythm guitar with the Margit Sky Project.

Like last year, this year will feature performers from the Kamloops Symphony and Sage Hills Singers, Drummers and Dancers, bringing a unique blend of the cultures under one roof. However, this year, the event will be held outdoors at the Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc Powwow Arbour, a perfect place for a concert that represents the healing and transformative power of music, according to Margit.

Echoing the sentiments shared by Margit, Rod (First Nations' name, Little Sky), the 'Sky' in the Margit Sky Project, remarked, "For me, the power of music to heal, communicate, and transform spaces is undeniable. That is why this concert experience is different than any other shows I have played. It's exciting to bridge the gap between cultures and perform as one."

For Rod, the concert holds a deeper meaning, as with his transition into the position of Elder in his community, now more than ever, he wants to tell his stories and the stories of those who are lost, through music.

The event will also feature the Kwséltkten Farmers' & Artisan Market. From 4 p.m. to 9 p.m., attendees will be able to enjoy Indigenous crafts, art, cultural presentations, and traditional food for purchase.

George Casimir, General Manager for the Community Futures Development Corporation of Central Interior First Nations, and a member of Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc is honoured to be a part of this event.

The concert part of the evening will begin at 6:30 p.m. until 8:30 p.m.

Admission this year will be absolutely free ensuring everyone can be a part of the unique experience. A significant portion of the proceeds collected will be donated to the <u>Indian Residential</u> <u>School Survivors Society</u>.
